

What else is happening in your Shtetl?

Port Phillip Council have got a new <u>dedicated sustainability website</u> listing <u>all relevant info and events</u> include a screening of Zero Impact Man on April 19th, a workshop on Energy Efficiency for those in Apartments on April 24th, and a Living Waste Free talk on 2nd May, an opportunity to speed date a sustainability expert on May 6th.



The EcoCentre is running lots of activities for 12-25 year olds over the coming weeks as part of the Alive Outside initiative. These free activities include maintaining the penguin habitat at St Kilda pier, building nest boxes for micro-bats and planting indigenous vegetation. These are perfect opportunities for students

who need to collect community service hours for their school.

The exciting news from Glen Eira Council is that they are introducing the

long-awaited <u>food waste recycling service</u> from May 1st. They will take all your food waste scraps eg egg shells, rice, coffee grounds, meat, potato peelings etc and turn them into compost. And to make this as simple as possible they are providing free kitchen-caddies to all who request one. This can be kept in the kitchen for easy disposal of scraps and then periodically emptied into your green bin. Glen Eira is also hosting several <u>sustainability</u>



<u>presentations</u>, <u>solar panel advice</u>, and the <u>regular food swap and working</u> <u>bee at the South Caulfield Community Garden</u>. <u>Murrenbeena Community Garden</u> also hosts get-togethers, talks and workshops.

The <u>Bayside Community Nursery</u> opened after its summer break last Saturday, and is now open for volunteering and sales on Thursdays and Saturdays 10am-12 noon until October. <u>The Banksia Bulletin</u> makes a great read for those wanting to find out about events and volunteering opportunities in the area.
