Rabbi Jonathan Keren-Black looks at the month of Elul which starts at sunset on August 18.

#### "A GOAL FOR ELUL – and the rest of your life!

The first of Tishri is the New Year for the calendar, but the first of Elul is also a new year - the new year for animal tithes\*. It was used to determine the start date for the animal tithe given to the priests in ancient Israel. Therefore, since the destruction of the Temple and the end of tithing, this new year has no longer been observed, although of course the month of Elul does mark the beginning of preparations for Rosh Hashanah.

It's always worth reviewing our traditions from time to time – perhaps there is a new interpretation or use we can put them to - and indeed this could be one! In times past, giving up an animal was a real sacrifice, since it was a substantial and measurable portion of your wealth. But today most of us eat animals without more than a passing thought to the life that was ended so that we could tuck in to a tasty bird or steak. We probably know that too much red meat, at least, is bad for us too. And it is really bad for the environment, especially for the rainforest that is being destroyed and the energy used to raise cattle, and not least the surprisingly large quantity of climate warming gasses produced by each animal! It is also bad for our fellow human beings, who are hungrier because of our affluent appetite for meat in place of staples. Yet, with the US, our meat consumption in Australia is almost the highest in the world, (beaten only by Luxembourg!), and almost three times the world average, at 123 kg/person/year!

So let's make Elul a month to reflect on what we eat – after all, during the High Holyday period we reflect on who we are – and, as the old adage says, 'we are what we eat'! Let's reflect on the meat, and resolve to show more respect for the life that it sacrificed so that we could eat it. If it is too much to give up eating meat 'cold turkey', let's commit to eating less – how about three times less, taking us down to the world average? How about saving it for Shabbat and Festivals, if that is what makes our meals special? And making it free range and organic when we do buy it. Give the animals of the world a Happier New Year this Elul!
